The margin element can be used to create a gutter between columns.
5. What are the usual five components of any layout?
Header, navbar, content/body, sidebar, and footer

1. When adding an image to a Web page, how do you decide whether to use the *figure* element or some other block-level element?
The figure element is used when an image is an important part of the content.
2. What is the difference between the column width and the content width for a column?
Content width changes the width of everything within the column whereas the column width includes the background.
3. What rule is used to import one style sheet into another?
The import rule.
4. What is specificity?
Describes how browsers decide which style rule prevails if there are conflicting rules in the same source.
5. In determining specificity, which type of selector has the greatest weight? Which has the lowest?
Generally the style that is farthest down is the one that prevails and the one farthest up has the least weight.
